# Superimposed Images

- Superimpose two images on one slide
- Use animation functions to “wipe across” from one image to the other



# Superimposed Images

- Images must be superimposable:
  - Same size
  - Same scene
- Examples:
  - “Before and After” post processing has been applied
  - “Then and Now” images
  - “Summer and Winter”
  - “Day and Night”

# Highlight Elements

- Highlight elements in an image and make them stand out
- Best for complex images with elements that are difficult to pick out
- Examples:
  - Images with many small text elements
  - “Person in a crowd” images
