And you have...

Global changes to exposure, contrast, colour, cropping, resize

Global levels, curves, sharpening, blur, noise

Adding text, objects and cloning

Adjust selective areas

Image enhancements locked in when saved

Detailed selections of image areas then combine images very flexibly

Work on detailed areas of the image with different tools

Limitless creative options

Retrospective adjustments at the time and later

Image editing provides more control



What are Layers?



What are Layers?

A basic, non image bearing, almost invisible, almost Canvas non editable, layer Layer Background Your first layer, usually the main image. Usually locked Layer A layer with a color or graduation Fill Layer Allows nondestructive adjustments to a variety of Adjustment parameters Layer

Types of Layers

Text Layer Automatically created by the text tool Video Layer Specialist applications, creating animated GIFs etc Duplicate Duplicates the layer below layer Allows nondestructive adjustments to a variety of Adjustment parameters Layer

Types of Layers

Layer Mask

Allows you to work on part of the image

Opacity

Control the amount that the layers below come through

Layer Style

Applies adjustable effects to a layer

Blending Modes

Control how layers combine, usually by trial and error

Language of Layers

Rename Layers

Opacity

Control the amount that the layers below come through


Merge

A range of options to create a consolidated image layer

Clipping mask

Lets you use the content of a layer to **mask** the layers above it
