

Jane (Hope) Bown 1925 -2014 ... Photo journalist for The Observer for over 60 years

- Brought up by 'aunts' and discovered that one of them was her mother when she was 12
- Started work as a 'chart corrector ' for WRNS
- Studied Photography at Guildford School of Art the only establishment offering a course in Photography
- Wedding Photographer until 1951. Then worked for 'The Observer' for over 60 years.

- Minimal equipment, no flash. Black and White. Concentrate on the eyes, informal style.
- Until the early 1960s, <u>Rolleiflex</u> camera. Then a 35mm <u>Pentax SLR</u>, before settling on the <u>Olympus</u> <u>OM-1</u> camera, often using an 85mm lens.
- Typically ten minutes or so with the subject.

She photographed hundreds of subjects, including <u>Orson Welles</u>, <u>Samuel</u> <u>Beckett</u>, <u>Sir John Betjeman</u>, <u>Woody Allen</u>, <u>Cilla Black</u>, <u>Quentin Crisp</u>, <u>John</u> <u>Lennon</u>, <u>Björk</u>, <u>Jayne Mansfield</u>, <u>Diana Dors</u>, <u>Henri Cartier</u>-<u>Bresson</u>, <u>Evelyn Waugh</u>, and <u>Margaret Thatcher</u>. She took <u>Queen</u> <u>Elizabeth II's eightieth birthday portrait</u>.
