Topic 1

Three issues were considered EU Immigration, EU Regulation & ECJ and Farming.

Alternative positions were described as below.

Members were asked with which proposition they most closely agreed; numbers in favour of each are reported below.

EU Immigration

- 1. We should institute a Green Card, Seasonal Migrant and Visa system for all EU citizens together with every other country
- 2. Implement an Identity Card in UK, as all EU countries except Denmark, Ireland and ourselves currently do so we know how many legal people are in the country and can choose to deport illegals.
- 3. Implement existing EU law which allows us to deport EU citizens, together with their dependants, if they are not able to support them
- 4. Continue existing UK approach to EU immigration laissez-faire?

Conclusion; the majority opinion was very much in favour of id cards and enforcement.

That rules are enforced seemed more important than what the rules were.

This policy is not consistent with any being proposed by any political party.

EU Regulation & ECJ

- 1. We make our rules and laws
- 2. Follow EU 'common rule book' around product specifications to enable free movement of goods.
- 3. Adhere to EU rules around State Aid and Environment as well as common rule book (2)

Conclusion; the majority opinion was very much in favour of following the common rule book, but there were conflicting views.

Farming

1. Do we need to be able to protect our farmers from global producers who could undercut them (Yes or No)
